There was discussion of possibly replacing the fencing all together. Mike said that Fall Ball ends November 6 and the netting can be removed after that date.

Capital Improvement Fundraising Committee

Julia Descoteaux presented. Julia said that they had surveyed approximately 95 people in regards to the public's needs for Recreation. She reported that the top three commented items were a toddler space, playground safety, and tennis courts. She also mentioned that there were comments regarding bathroom renovations and safety of the docks, playground, pathways. Julia had said the committee is exploring a way to access the creek and make the area more accessible and known to the public. She said there is also talk of exploring a dog park, ice rink, and walking path options. The negative input from the public dealt mostly with how the improvement would effect taxes, but the overall public view was positive. She has created an Instagram for the committee, @stanfordreccampaign. Steven Horowitz was also present at the meeting. He is a member of the Capital Improvement Committee as well and part of the Design Subcommittee. He said they have three landscape architects for proposals to increase access to the creek, create handicap accessibility, but may need more input on these items than other items. Steven asked the Commission about the possibility of a community garden at the Rec. Teddy explained that the Lions Club was exploring that idea either at the Town Hall or across from the Nature Preserve on Salt Point Turnpike. Lauren had mentioned that maybe a gardening/flower planting day at the Rec would be a nice community event and help spruce up the park. Lauren will provide Julia and Steven will a list of activities planned for the Rec and traffic patterns to help the Committee better understand the busier times of the year at the Rec.
